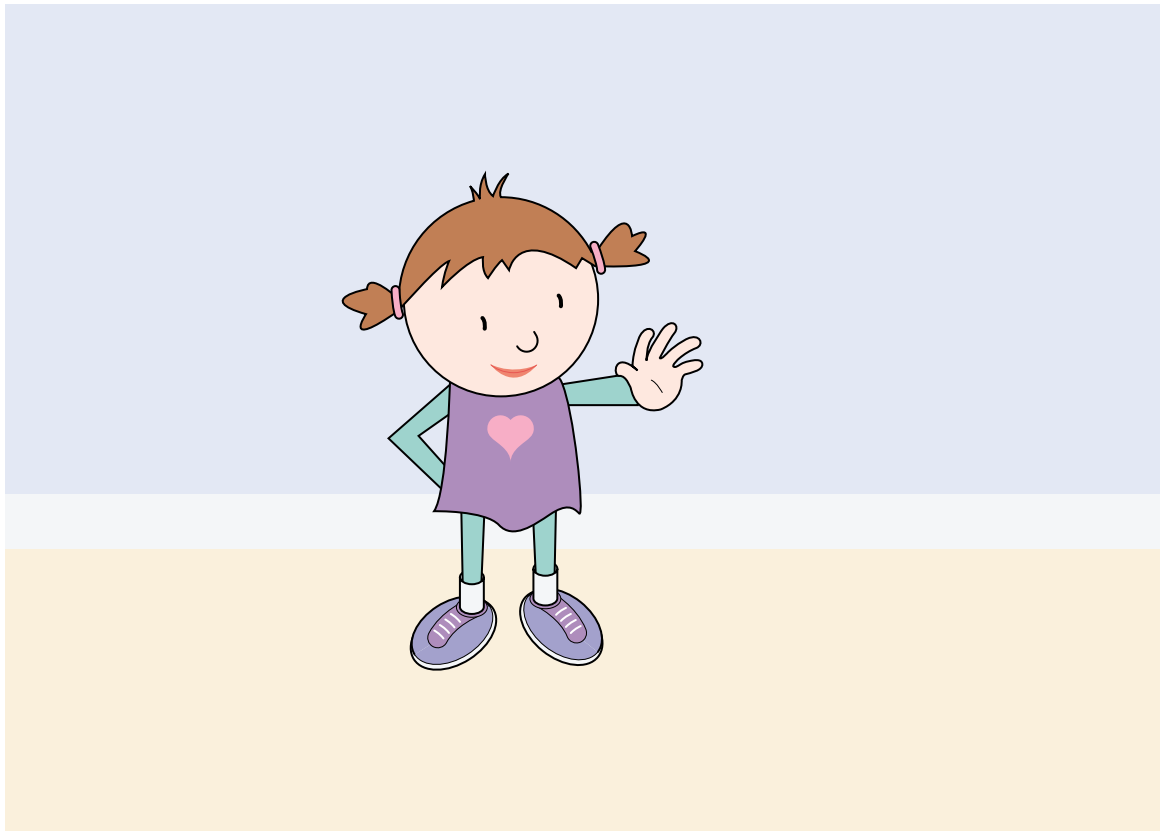


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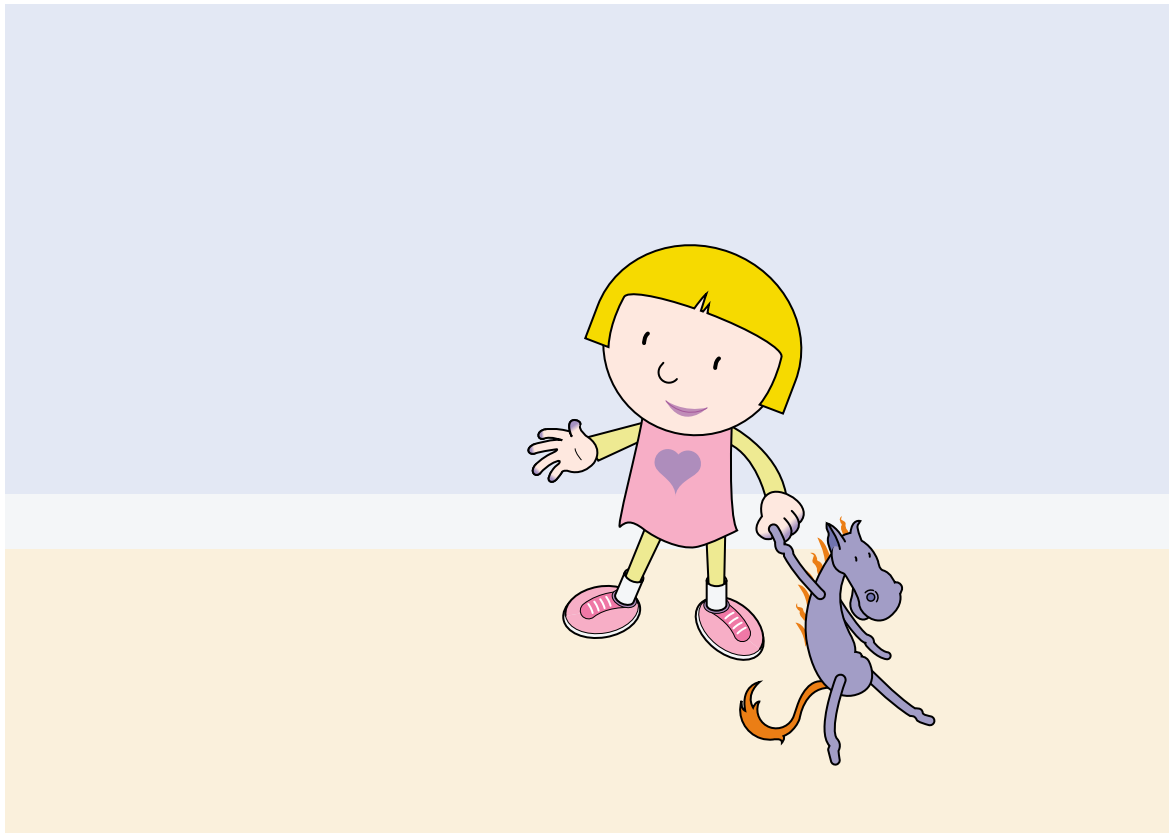
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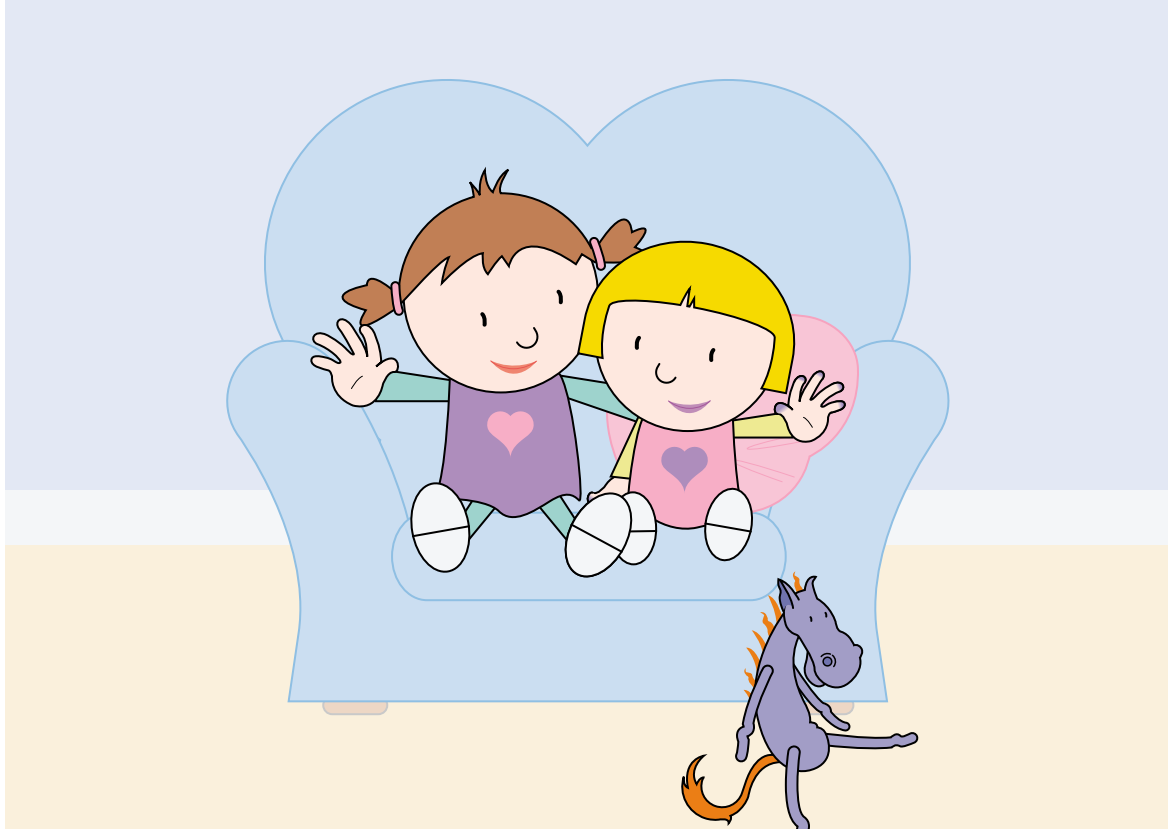


This is Rosie.

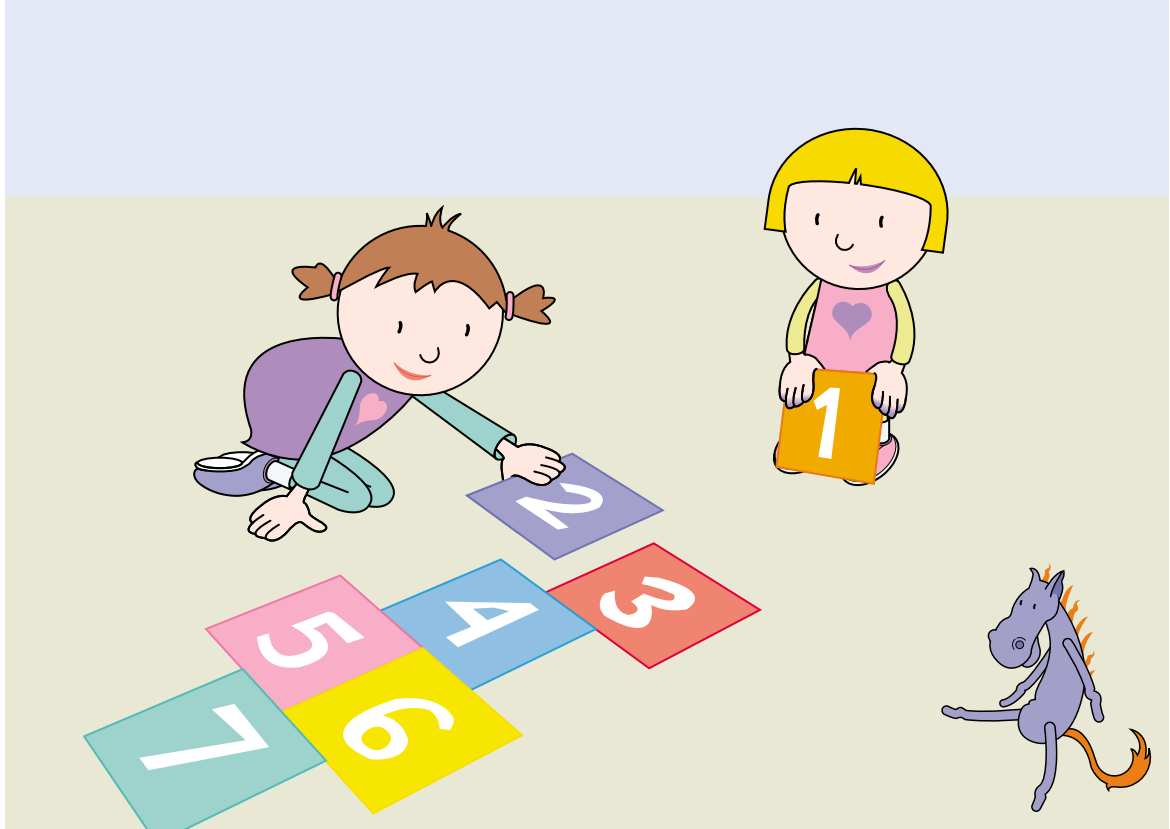


This is her sister Violet.

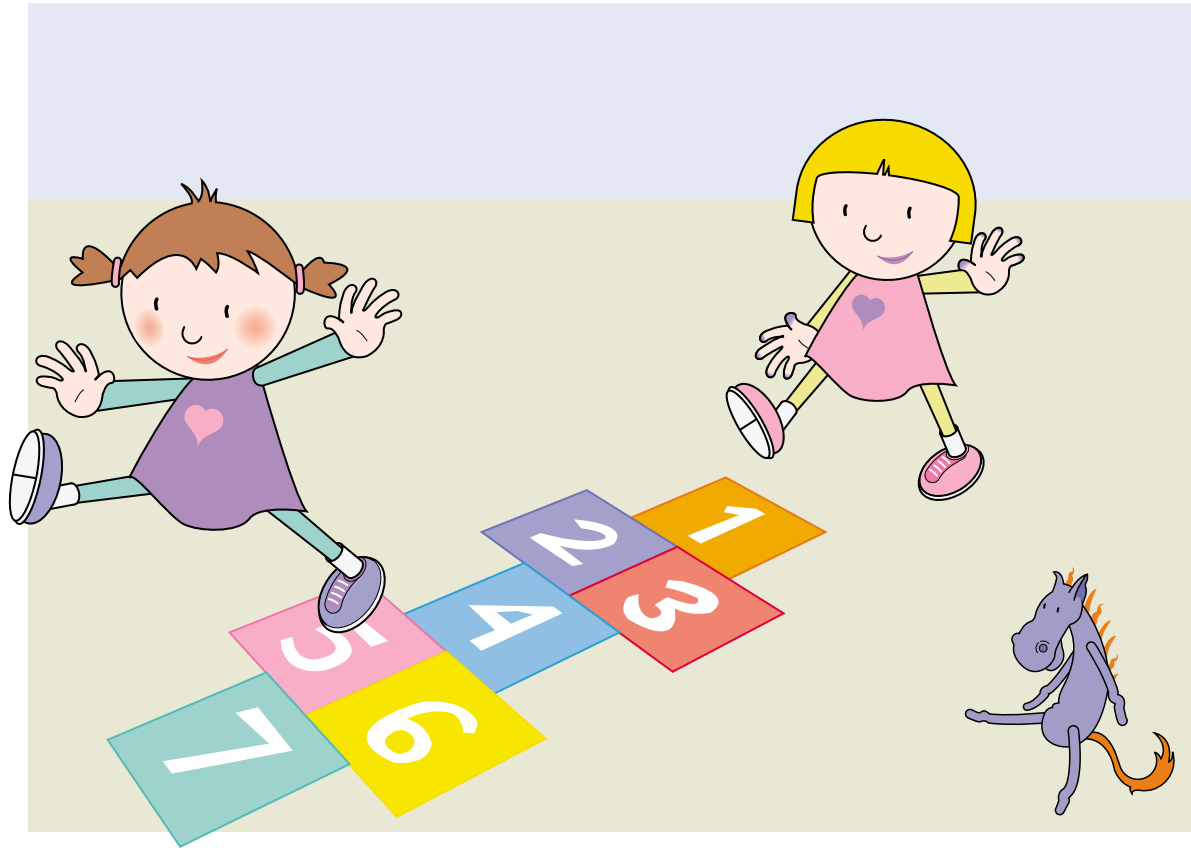
Rosie is well all over.

Rosie and Violet love playing.



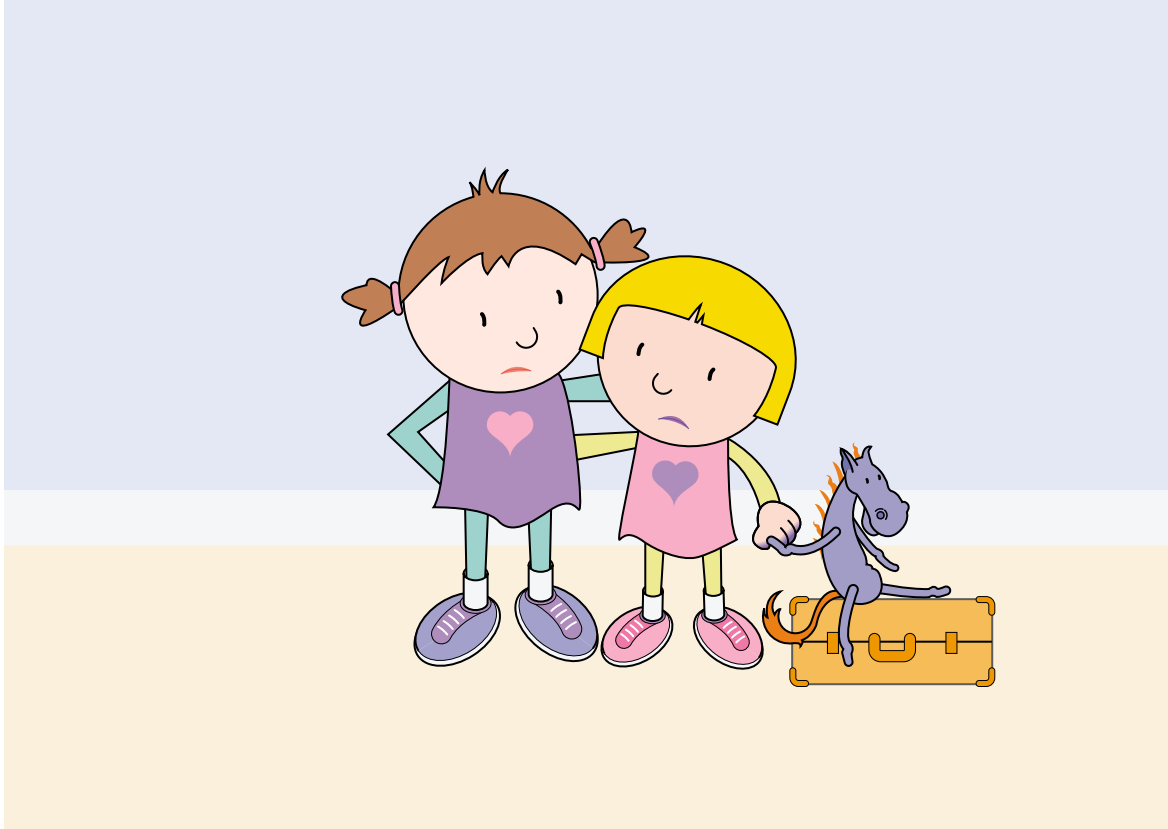
Rosie hops and skips and jumps a lot.

Then Rosie feels blue too.

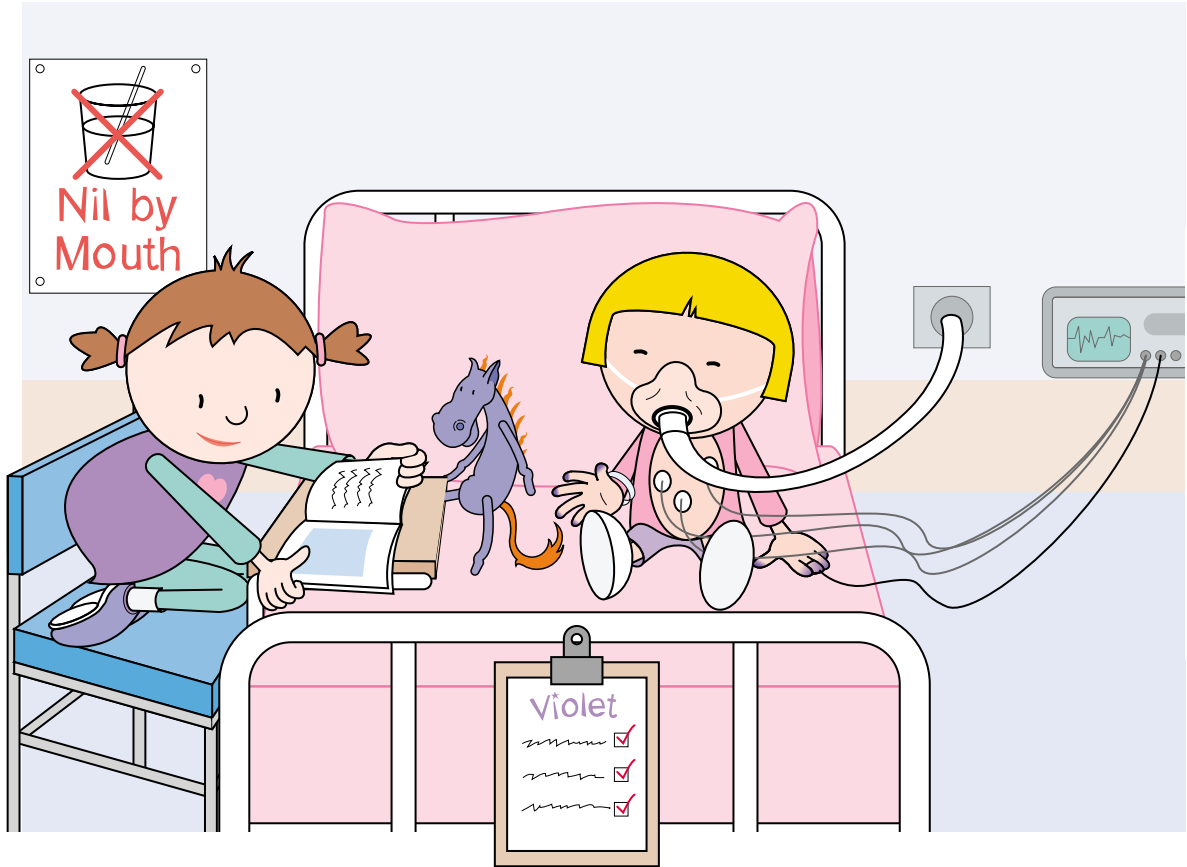


When Violet is better she comes home.
Then Rosie and Violet are in the pink - until the next time.

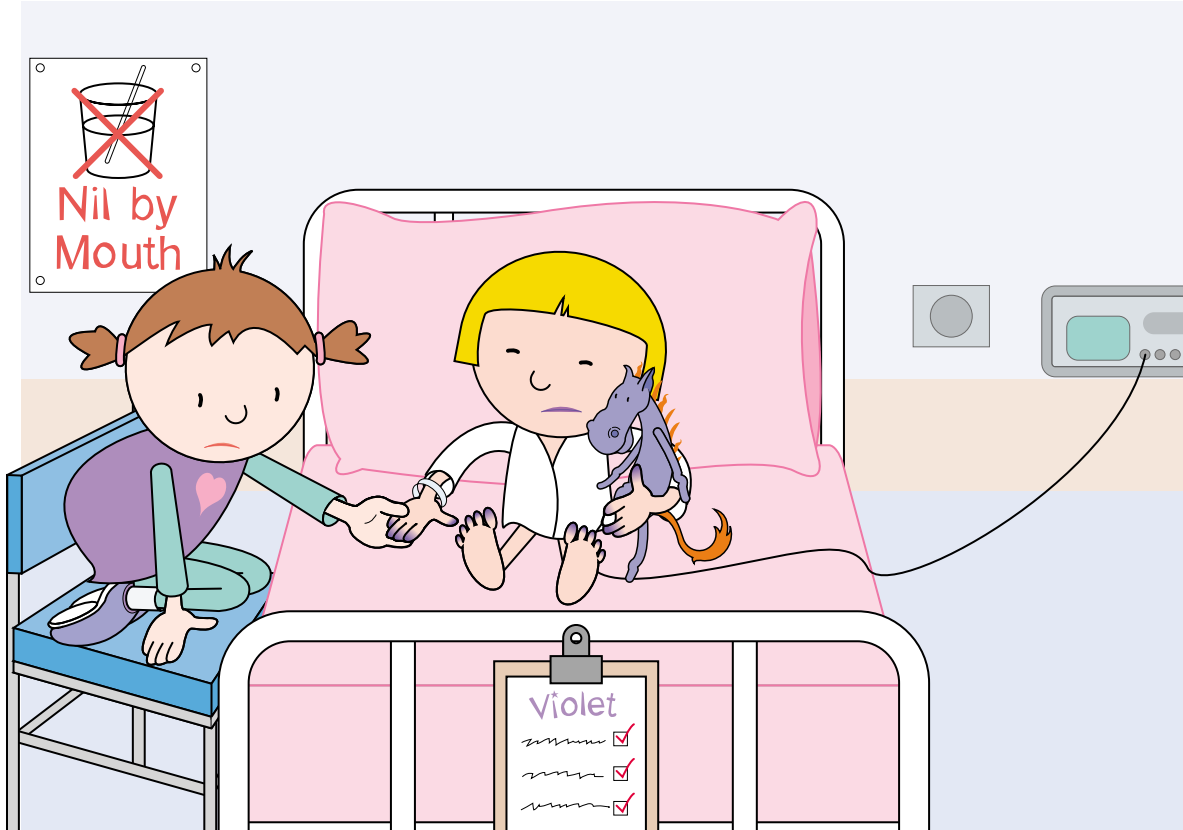


One day Violet went so blue

Rosie looked pink and felt blue.



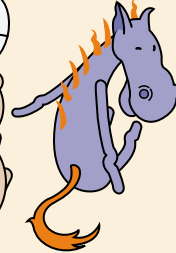
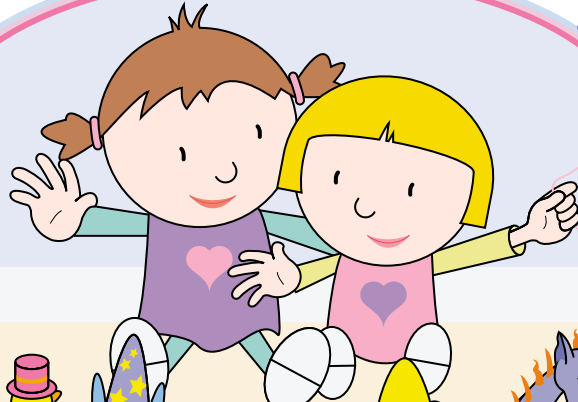

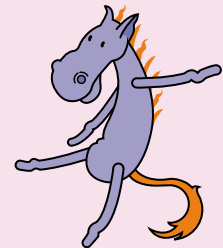
